## Neerim Frog Festival Celebrates Rejuvenated Wetlands

The Neerim South Wetlands played host to the 2017 Neerim Frog Festival, celebrating a decade-long rehabilitation of the wetlands by Neerim District Landcare group.

Following a 'pilot' festival last year supported by VicForests, this year's Neerim Frog Festival attracted more support, activities and attendees, who came out to see, and appreciate, Landcare's work on the wetlands.

This year's festival saw local families enjoying guided wetland walks, environmental presentations, fire truck displays from the CFA and frog face painting. A Lions Club barbecue, a coffee cart and a milkshake stand ensured all attendees enjoyed a meal while at the festival.

Live animal shows including snakes, lizards, a flying fox, an eight-week-old emu and other native fauna delighted the kids (and the big kids) in attendance.

Sean Dignum, Festival Organiser, said he hoped that as they improve and refine the Frog Festival programme, the event will continue to grow in popularity.

"This year was a great success with more than 250 people attending the festival. With the community's enthusiasm and the increasing support, we hope it can be bigger and better each year. It's been fantastic that VicForests are so keen to help us showcase Neerim District Landcare's work." He said.

With the Neerim South Wetlands continuing to improve under the stewardship of Landcare, VicForests will continue its support to help raise awareness and appreciation of the Neerim South Wetlands, pledging a three-year sponsorship of the event.

Liz Langford, Regional Engagement Manager VicForests, said VicForests is committed to supporting the communities in which it operates, and that includes assisting local organisations such as the Neerim District Landcare.

VicForests is a native timber harvesting organisation which regrows all harvested areas with the same type of forest that was originally there and only harvests around 0.04% of Victoria's forests each year.

This small percentage of harvesting is vital to many regional Victorian communities that rely on the native timber industry.

The native timber industry contributes hundreds of millions of dollars and thousands of jobs to regional Victoria regional each year.

VicForests is certified by the Australian Forestry Standard which is endorsed by the world's largest forest certification scheme; PEFC.
